Vocabulary	
<b>Conclusion</b>	The ending of an essay that meaningfully wraps up all the provided information. Does not add new information.
<b>Summary Statement</b>	A transition sentence that tells your reader that the essay is finished while reviewing the important details.
<b>Restated Thesis</b>	A rewording of your thesis designed to ensure your reader understood your point.
<b>Evidence Sentence</b>	A body paragraph sentence that contains important information for the summary statement.

## Summary Statements

1. Start with, "In conclusion,"

3. Write the sentence and read it aloud to ensure it sounds effectively written.

## Restated Thesis

1. Read your thesis in your introduction.
2. Try to rewrite it as a question.
3. Make sure you do not add new information.
